



Administrative Summary Report

INCIDENT DESCRIPTION

I went into the 25th district on 51319 at aprox 4pm. I went up to the desk and waited for the woman behind it later found to be Spoin Star [REDACTED] to have a minute. After 30 seconds she growled what do you need with out looking up, her tone was of being bothered by my presence. I stated I need to make a accident report that involved injury and a crime hit and run Per CPD's policy and directives you do not need to make a report to file and insurance claim but a report always needs to be filed when injury and/or a crime such as hit a run was involved. THE EXAMPLE THEY USED WAS MY EXACT CASE. Spoin started getting ready to take my report when she overheard me say I wasn't notifying my insurance at that point SHE DECIDED she wasn't taking any report if I wasn't going to let my insurance know. Spoin Star [REDACTED] who identified herself as a civilian would not give me her name or star because she was a civilian. Civillans have no authority to generate legal documents that are admissible in court, nor do they have the ability to transcribe eye witness testimony on to legal documents. She is not law enforcement but she is a Civil Service Officer, and if she is indeed a civilian dressed in police attire and working under the direct command Sgt. Hawwat. that is a severe breach of CPD protocol and directives. My guess is she lied because she refused and did not want to identify herself. Fortunatley Spoin Star [REDACTED] wrote her information on the driver information exchange card she handed me. While Spoin refused to write the report the situation became tense. Sgt. Hawwat who was sitting ten feet away the whole time came over and escalated the situation by yelling for a minute straight how she didn't want to hear anymore outta me and what was going on why was I there. Spoin lied and said I was cursing at her, I never swore in any context and I don't believe she even thinks I cursed at her. When the Sgt. calmed down I explained that I was parked half way out my car when a suv backed and smashed into my car throwing and slamming the back of my head and neck into the framework of the car, when I got to my feet I told the other driver of the black suv lic plate number [REDACTED] to pull over he said no 3 or so times one time because he had drugs in the car he couldn't. Sgt. Hawat told Spoin to put what I just said in a report, Sgt. Hawat said she did not want to hear anything else and went and sat down. At this point I pulled out my phone and started recording. Spoin made what I thought was my report never asked me one question, and when I talked to the major accident department found out she wrote the wrong report number on the information card she gave me, didn't include the suspects lic. plate, that his arm was in sling, none of what Sgt. Hawwat 2116 told her too. The report she generated is completely made up not one not a single detail in the report is correct, nor is the report number she gave me a real number. Major accidents division said that I had to go back and get a proper report done. Most likely in their opinion she purposely put a made up report number. I was the victim of a crime and the Police treated me worse than the criminal. How can she refuse to take a report, then generate a false one giving me a report number that doesn't exist
