INCIDENT DESCRIPTION

On 05/04/2020 my former roommate [REDACTED] whom I have a current order of protection against was harrasing me. I reached out to police and he was arrested. He was later released the same day and came back to my apartment with two officers, officer Ryva and another whom I didnt get his name. The officers stated that they escorted [REDACTED] to my apartment to retrieve all of his belongings. I informed the officers that [REDACTED] didnt have any belongings in the apartment. I also stated to the officers that I was uncomfortable with [REDACTED] presence and I asked if they could wait with [REDACTED] in the apartment he lives in while they waited for a supervisor to show. They refused. Sargeant McCray came to the apartment and explained to [REDACTED] that he wasn't supposed to be at my apartment. When I asked why he was released they said he was released under the covid-19 act and that of he attempted to harrass me that I would just have to keep calling 911. My children and I could be dead by the time an officer shows up. I dont understand why it is ok for this man to continually harrass me and my children. I dont understand if it'll take this man to harm me or my children before this matter is taken seriously, especially knowing that this man has a history of stalking and violating OOP's. At one point when McCray was at the apartment my roommate said in front of her "aha that's why they ain't helping you bitch I'll be back". I understand that this covid-19 pandemic is beyond overwhelming for many but that is no excuse for people's rights to be violated or for people to have to endure what I am going through. I should not have to vacate my apartment(I dont have anywhere else to move to) because this man is stalking me and the police dont want to do their job because covid-19 is stressing them out. At any point this man can kick the door in and I would've have time to call 911. My children and I could be dead by the time cops arrive because lord knows that it can taken CPD officers quite some time to respond to a call. Especially in African American neighborhoods. I dont want me or my children to be harmed nor do I want to be in a situation where I'm left with no choice but to harm someone else in self defense. I called 911 many times today regarding this matter and it seems like cops were too overwhelmed to perform their due diligence. My family and I shouldnt have to suffer because of that. I shouldnt have to stay up all night watching my front door to make sure [REDACTED] doesn't kick my door in or send someone to kick it in and harm my children and I. I mean [REDACTED] sees that no matter what he does, he gets away with it without any consequences. He's going to continue to harrass because he feels like there are no consequences, especially when police officers are pretty much saying "hey its nothing we can do, if he bothers you again just call 911". The treatment I received from offers was beyond absurd. I was treated as if I did something wrong because I called 911 several times because [REDACTED] is harassing my children and I.
